Eastbound State Road (SR) 826/Palmetto Expressway Overnight Ramp and Lane Closures on Tuesday, March 19

MIAMI, Fla. – On Tuesday, March 19, two eastbound travel lanes on SR 826/Palmetto Expressway and the ramp from eastbound Palmetto Expressway to southbound I-95 will be closed in preparation for a traffic shift through this area. Closures will occur as follows:

At 9 p.m., one eastbound lane will be closed between NW 10 Avenue and NW 7 Avenue Extension. At 11:59 p.m., a second eastbound lane and the ramp from eastbound Palmetto Expressway to southbound I-95 will be closed. One eastbound through lane will remain open.

Traffic going from eastbound Palmetto Expressway to southbound I-95 will be detoured as follows:

- Continue east on Palmetto Expressway to NW 7 Avenue Extension
- Turn right onto SR 7/US 441/NW 2 Avenue
- Take the ramp on the left-hand side for southbound I-95

All lanes and the ramp will reopen at 5 a.m. This work is necessary to shift traffic for upcoming construction. Please note this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
