## Landscape Project along Campbell Drive Begins Week of February 14

*From State Road (SR) 997/Krome Avenue to SR 5/US 1*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a landscaping project the week of February 14, 2022. The project limits extend along SW 312 Street/Campbell Drive from SR 997/Krome Avenue to SR 5/US 1 in the City of Homestead. Work will include installing landscape within the new median. The project will cost an estimated \$267,936 and will take roughly two years to be completed. The installation of trees is expected to take several months before the project moves into the establishment phase.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. on weekdays and weekends. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction-related impacts. Please use caution when traveling through construction zones.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
