FDOT Community Traffic Safety Team to Conduct Traffic Safety Operation

Thursday, March 11, in North Miami and Biscayne Park

MIAMI, Fla. - The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six, in coordination with North Miami Police, Biscayne Park Police and other local law enforcement agencies, will conduct a multi-agency traffic safety enforcement and education detail at various locations in North Miami and Biscayne Park from noon until 5 p.m., Thursday, March 11, 2021.

Law enforcement will focus on distracted driving (as part of FDOT's on-going *Put it Down* Campaign), aggressive driving, red-light running, speeding, seatbelt use, move-over law compliance and general traffic safety.

This event is being coordinated by the Northeast Community Traffic Safety Team (NE CTST) with the assistance of FDOT's Community Traffic Safety Program (CTSP). The goal of the CTSP is to reduce the number and severity of traffic crashes through a comprehensive, multi-jurisdictional approach that combines the four E's of safety: Enforcement, Emergency Services, Education, and Engineering.
