Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Project Completed at Various Locations throughout Miami-Dade County

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has successfully completed the construction of an ITS replacement project on December 3, 2021. The design-build project started in May 2021 and cost an estimated \$1.4 million. Work was performed throughout Miami-Dade County at the following locations:

- State Road (SR) SR 9A/I-95 north of Ives Dairy Road
- SR 9A/I-95 Express Lanes at Miami Gardens Drive
- SR 907/Alton Road at Chase Avenue
- SR 112/Arthur Godfrey Road/W 41 Street at North Jefferson Avenue
- SR 112/I-195/Julia Tuttle Causeway at NE 36 Street Entrance Ramp
- SR 9A/I-95 at SR 836
- SR 9A/I-95 at SW 9 Street
- US 1 north of SW 200 Street

The scope of work included replacing ITS cabinets, updating and migrating ITS devices to current standards, replacing Dynamic Message Signs (DMS), replacing Closed Circuit Television Cameras (CCTV) and installing new poles.

FDOT completed this project with the support of elected officials and the community. SICE, Inc., was the contractor.
