FDOT Completes Roadway Project Along State Road (SR) 944/NW 54 Street and SR 25/NW 36 Street

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has successfully completed a roadway project along SR 944/NW 54 Street at NW 14 Avenue and SR 25/NW 36 Street between NW 20 Avenue and NW 19 Avenue in the City of Miami. The project began in October 2021 and had a final cost of \$582,000. Horsepower Electric, Inc. was the contractor. FDOT completed the project on time and under budget with the support of the elected officials and the community.

The following scope of work was performed on this project: installing a new traffic signal and flashing beacons at the NW 54 Street location at NW 14 Avenue and adding a mid-block crossing on the west side of the intersection. The project also included installing a pedestrian crosswalk with an overhead beacon at NW 36 Street between NW 20 Avenue and NW 19 Avenue.
