## FDOT Completes Roadway Project Along State Road (SR) 925/NW 3 Court/NW 3 Avenue

*From NW 1 Street to NW 8 Street*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) successfully completed the roadway project along SR 925/NW 3 Court/NW 3 Avenue from NW 1 Street to NW 8 Street.

The project began in June 2020 and cost an estimated \$5.1 million. FDOT completed this project on schedule and under budget with the support of elected officials and the community. Weekley Asphalt Paving, Inc. was the contractor.

The following scope of work was performed on this project: reconstructing pedestrian curb ramps; enhancing sidewalks and guardrails; installing new drainage structures; improving vehicular and pedestrian traffic signals and signage; installing bicycle lane signage and pavement markings; and repaving and restriping the roadway.
