### **FDOT Completes State Road (SR) A1A/Collins Avenue Safety Project**

*At the Intersection of 189 Street*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – On Monday, June 6, 2022, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) successfully completed the pedestrian safety project at the intersection of SR A1A/Collins Avenue and 189 Street, in the City of Sunny Isles Beach. The three-month project began in March 2022 and cost an estimated \$220,700.

This project was part of a district wide pedestrian/bicycle safety pushbutton contract and was completed on time and under budget, with the support of elected officials and the community. Weekley Asphalt Paving, Inc. was the contractor for this project.

The scope of work included: installation of a new traffic signal mast arm; reconstruction of the pedestrian crosswalks, ramps, and sidewalks; enhancements to pedestrian and vehicular signs and pavements markings; and repaving and restriping the roadway.
