FDOT Completes Roadway Project Along State Road (SR) 989/Allapattah Road/SW 112 Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has successfully completed the roadway and lighting project along State Road (SR) 989/Allapattah Road/SW 112 Avenue, from south of SR 5/US 1/S Dixie Highway to SW 248 Street. The one-year project began in July 2021 and cost an estimated \$2.4 million. FDOT completed the project before time and under budget with the support of the elected officials and the community. The contractor for this project was JVA Engineering Contractor, Inc.

The scope of work performed on this project included: widening the road and medians in some areas; improving traffic signals and storm water drainage; adding dedicated turn lanes; installing high-emphasis crosswalks and pedestrian signs and reconstructing the raised island at the intersection near Southland Mall; and repaving the road. The project also includes upgrading streetlights at intersections with pedestrian crossings.
