Full Nighttime Closures of NW 116 Way Bridge between NW South River Drive and Okeechobee Road

January 30 through February 2, 2023

MIAMI, Fla. – Full closures of the NW 116 Way Bridge between NW South River Drive and Okeechobee Road will take place nightly between the hours of 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. on Monday, January 30, through Thursday, February 2, 2023. The closures will allow the contractor to complete work in this area. The following detours will be implemented:

- Motorists heading northbound on NW 116 Way who wish to access Okeechobee Road will be detoured to turn right on to NW South River Drive, turn left on to NW 105 Way and proceed on to Okeechobee Road.
- Motorists heading southbound on Hialeah Gardens Boulevard toward Okeechobee Road who wish to continue to NW 116 Way will have to turn left on to Okeechobee Road, make a right at NW 105 Way, make a right to NW S River Drive and turn left to continue south on to NW 116 Way.
- Motorists heading westbound/eastbound on Okeechobee Road who wish to access NW 116 Way will be detoured to the NW 105 Way intersection, make a right at NW 105 Way, make a right to NW S River Drive, and turn left to continue south on to NW 116 Way.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions.

This project is part of the corridor-wide reconstruction of the SR 25/US 27/Okeechobee Road from the Broward County Line to SR 826/Palmetto Expressway. This work will improve safety, enhance mobility along this Strategic Intermodal Systems (SIS) corridor, and inspire innovative transportation solutions, connecting commuters throughout Miami-Dade County.
