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FDOT Golden Glades Interchange (GGI) Project Lane and Ramp Closures & Detours

Sunday, September 15 to Friday, September 20

MIAMI, Fla. – As part of the ongoing interchange reconstruction work, contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will be implementing various roadway closures and detours. These closures will allow crews to perform bridge work, stormwater drainage installation, roadway paving, utility work and temporary concrete barrier wall installation.

From 9 p.m. on Sunday, September 15 until 5 a.m. on Monday, September 16 (Monday, September 16 and Tuesday, September 17 will be alternate dates):

All lanes along southbound State Road (SR) 91/Florida's Turnpike will be closed at SR 852/NW 215 Street/County Line Road and traffic will be detoured as follows:

- Take Exit 47 to SR 817/NW 27 Avenue
- Turn right onto southbound SR 817/NW 27 Avenue
- Turn left for the ramp onto eastbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway and continue east to the Golden Glades Interchange

All lanes along northbound SR 91/Florida's Turnpike will be closed at the Golden Glades Interchange and traffic will be detoured via two options as follows:

Detour Route Option #1

- Take the ramp to northbound SR 7/US 441/NW 2 Avenue
- Turn left onto westbound SR 852/NW 215 Street/County Line Road
- Take the ramp onto northbound SR 91/Florida's Turnpike

Detour Route Option #2

- Take the ramp to westbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway
- Exit at SR 817/NW 27 Avenue
- Turn right onto northbound SR 817/NW 27 Avenue
- Turn right onto eastbound SR 852/NW 215 Street/County Line Road
- Take the ramp onto northbound SR 91/Florida's Turnpike

Sunday, September 15 to Thursday, September 19 between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m.:

The northbound and southbound SR 9A/Interstate 95 (I-95) Express Lanes between NW 29 Street and SR 860/NW 183 Street/Miami Gardens Drive will be closed. Traffic will be directed to use the general purpose lanes along SR 9A/I-95.

The ramp from NW 167 Street to westbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway will be closed and traffic will be detoured as follows:

- Take the ramp to northbound SR 7/US 441/NW 2 Avenue
- Turn left onto westbound NW 7 Avenue Extension
- Continue west for westbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway

The entrance ramp from NW 151 Street to southbound SR 9A/I-95 will be closed and traffic will be detoured as follows:

- Continue south on SR 7/US 441/NW 7 Avenue
- Turn left onto eastbound SR 916/NW 135 Street
- Take the ramp onto southbound SR 9A/I-95

All lanes along eastbound NW 151 Street will be closed between SR 7/US 441/NW 7 Avenue and SR 9A/I-95 and traffic will be detoured as follows:

- Go south on SR 7/US 441/NW 7 Avenue
- Turn left onto eastbound SR 916/NW 135 Street
- Turn left onto northbound NW 5 Avenue
- Turn right onto eastbound NW 151 Street

All lanes along westbound NW 151 Street will be closed between SR 7/US 441/NW 7 Avenue and SR 9A/I-95 and traffic will be detoured as follows:

- Go south on NW 5 Avenue
- Turn right onto westbound SR 916/NW 135 Street
- Turn right onto northbound SR 7/US 441/NW 7 Avenue
- Turn left onto westbound NW 151 Street

Continuous closure:

NW 6 Avenue is closed between NW 151 Street and NW 162 Street while construction crews work on stormwater drainage improvements and replace the bridge over the Biscayne Canal. Contractors for Florida Power & Light (FPL) and City of North Miami Beach are also performing utility work along NW 6 Avenue. A detour is in place until summer 2025 to complete this phase of work.

Drivers and pedestrians who want to go north onto NW 6 Avenue from the intersection of NW 151 Street and NW 6 Avenue will be detoured as follows:

- Go east along NW 151 Street
- Turn right onto southbound South Biscayne River Drive
- Take the third exit at the roundabout onto northbound North Miami Avenue
- Turn left onto northbound Memorial Highway, which converts to NW 2 Avenue
- Continue north along NW 2 Avenue to NW 165 Street

Drivers and pedestrians who want to go south onto NW 6 Avenue from the intersection of NW 165 Street and NW 2 Avenue will be detoured as follows:

- Continue south along NW 2 Avenue, which converts to Memorial Highway
- Turn right onto southbound North Miami Avenue

- Turn right onto northbound South Biscayne River Drive
- Turn left onto westbound NW 151 Street
- Continue west along NW 151 Street to NW 6 Avenue

These lane closures below will occur nightly as needed:

SR 9A/I-95 between SR 916/NW 135 Street and the Golden Glades Interchange

- At 9 p.m., one lane in both directions will be closed as needed.
- At 11 p.m., a second lane in both directions will be closed as needed.

SR 826/Palmetto Expressway between NW 12 Avenue and NW 7 Avenue Extension

- At 9 p.m., one lane in both directions will be closed as needed.
- At 11 p.m., a second lane in both directions will be closed as needed.

SR 91/Florida's Turnpike between SR 860/NW 183 Street/Miami Gardens Drive and SR 9A/I-95

- From 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., up to two lanes in both directions will be closed as needed.

Detours will be clearly marked. Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
