Nighttime Lane Closures Along State Road (SR)826/Palmetto Expressway and SR 9A/I-95 This Week

For Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Project

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Wednesday, August 17, 2022, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will continue work at two locations as part of the ITS replacement project. Two Closed Circuit Television Cameras (CCTV) poles will be installed during the operations. There will be nighttime closures along SR 826/Palmetto Expressway and SR 9A/I-95 on the following dates:

Wednesday, August 17 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.

One westbound lane will be closed along NW 167 Street, next to the Palmetto Expressway, between NW 51 Place and NW 49 Avenue. One lane will remain open at all times

Thursday, August 18 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.

One southbound lane will be closed along SR 9A/I-95 near NW 212 Terrace.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
