Nighttime Closure of Southbound State Road (SR) 5/US 1 Near SW 62 Avenue Scheduled Saturday, Wednesday

Additional lane closures this week on SR 826/Palmetto Expressway for Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Project

MIAMI, Fla. – On Saturday night, August 5, there will be a full closure of southbound US 1 near SW 62 Avenue for continued work as part of the ITS Replacement Project. A detour will be established to guide drivers around the work.

From 10 p.m. Saturday, August 5, to 6 a.m., Sunday, August 6

Drivers traveling south along US 1 will have to:

- Turn north on SW 62 Avenue
- Turn west on SW 72 Street
- Turn south on SW 67 Avenue
- Turn south on US 1

Drivers traveling west along SW 80 Street wishing to travel south on US 1 will have to:

- Continue west on SW 80 Street
- Turn south on US 1
- Turn east on SW 63 Avenue
- Continue east on SW 78 Street
- Turn south on SW 62 Avenue
- Turn west of SW 80 Street
- Turn south on US 1

Drivers traveling west along SW 63 Avenue wishing to travel south on US 1 will have to:

- Turn north on US 1
- Turn south on SW 62 Avenue
- Turn west of SW 80 Street
- Turn south on US 1

Additional ITS work is scheduled later in the week along SR 826/Palmetto Expressway near NW 67 Avenue.

From 11 p.m. Wednesday, August 9, to 5 a.m. Thursday, August 10

 Two eastbound lanes will be closed along SR 826/Palmetto Expressway west of NW 67 Avenue

At least one lane will remain open in each direction at all times.
