New Traffic Changes Implemented as Part of State Road (SR) 922/NE 125 Street and SR 909/West Dixie Highway Project

Changes to sections of West Dixie Highway, NE 7 Avenue and NE 124 Street

MIAMI, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) NE 125 Street Roadway Project, several new traffic patterns have been recently implemented along sections of West Dixie Highway, NE 7 Avenue and NE 124 Street in the City of North Miami (please see map below). Drivers are encouraged to use caution and follow all posted signs.

West Dixie Highway between NE 125 Street and NE 126 Street

- Northbound traffic only

Drivers traveling southbound on West Dixie Highway will be routed to

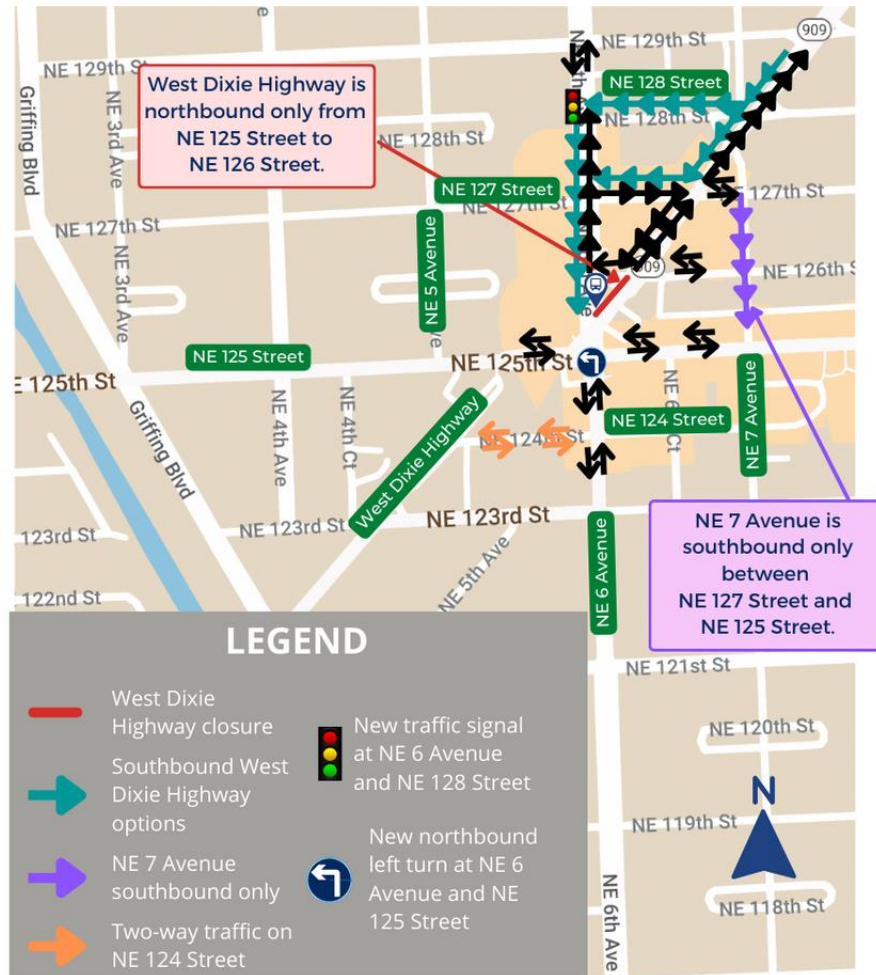
- Turn west on NE 128 Street and turn north or south on NE 6 Avenue at the newly installed traffic signal *or*
- Turn west on NE 127 Street and turn north or south on NE 6 Avenue *or*
- Turn west on NE 126 Street; drivers will only be able to turn north on NE 6 Avenue

NE 7 Avenue between NE 127 Street and NE 125 Street

- Southbound traffic only

NE 124 Street between West Dixie Highway and NE 6 Avenue

- Converting to a two-way eastbound and westbound street



These improvements are expected to increase safety and ease congestion for pedestrian and motorists around the busy intersection of NE 125 Street and NE 6 Avenue.
