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SR 913/Rickenbacker Causeway Flyover Bridge Ramp to Northbound SR 9A/I-95 Open to Traffic

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has successfully completed the necessary concrete deck rehabilitation work and reopened the ramp from westbound State Road (SR) 913/Rickenbacker Causeway to northbound Interstate 95 (I-95), on Saturday, August 3.

Work on the ramp from westbound SR 913/Rickenbacker Causeway to southbound SR 5/US 1 was completed earlier with that ramp reopened on July 20.

The concrete repair work is part of an ongoing rehabilitation project on the bridges, which are nearly 50 years old. This work is imperative to the structural integrity of the bridges and the safety of the traveling public.

The Department worked closely with Miami-Dade County, the Village of Key Biscayne, the City of Miami, local law enforcement and emergency responders to develop and successfully implement a traffic plan that allowed contractors to perform the necessary work while maximizing safety and minimizing traffic impacts.

“I want to thank our local partners for their support as we worked to develop a Maintenance of Traffic Plan and minimize impacts to the traveling public,” said FDOT District Six Secretary Stacy L. Miller, P.E. “Their assistance and collaboration ensured the success of this phase of work.”

Drivers should note that traffic signals and travel lanes have been returned to their original condition through this area. Drivers traveling west on the Rickenbacker Causeway cannot turn left at Brickell Avenue and the intersection of SW 26 Road and South Miami Avenue has been fully reopened.

Rehabilitation work on the bridges is ongoing and weeknight lane and ramp closures will be implemented as needed during nighttime hours to clean and paint the existing traffic railings and remove the containment platforms underneath the SR 913/Rickenbacker Causeway Flyover Bridges. All lanes will reopen by 6 a.m. daily.
