SR 913/SW/SE 26 Road Roadway Project Begins Week of November 12

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway improvement project the week of November 12, 2024. The project limits are along SR 913/SW/SE 26 Road from SW 1 Avenue to Rickenbacker Causeway. This project will cost an estimated \$2.4 million and is expected to take about eight months to complete.

The scope of work for this project involves constructing a bicycle lane along SW 26 Road from north of SW 1 Avenue to south of South Miami Avenue, widening the sidewalk on the north side of the road, modifying drainage structures and upgrading pedestrian curb ramps, signage, and pavement markings. Additionally, this project includes installing high emphasis crosswalks at various locations, upgrading the pedestrian signals at South Miami Avenue and Brickell Avenue, and repaving and restriping the roadway.

Construction will be done in stages with temporary lane closures scheduled to avoid special community events and peak hours of traffic. Temporary roadway and sidewalk detours will be in place when necessary. Access to and from adjacent neighborhoods and businesses will be maintained during construction. Please note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
