FDOT to Host Public Meeting for NW 67 Avenue Improvements Corridor Study

July 19, 2023

MIAMI, Florida. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a public meeting both in-person and virtually, for the NW 67 Avenue Improvements Corridor Study. The NW 67 Avenue corridor is approximately 0.81 miles long; and is adjacent to the Village of Virginia Gardens and the western section of the Miami International Airport (MIA) in Miami-Dade County, Florida. The public meeting will provide the community with the opportunity to be directly engaged in the planning and development process of the study. The meeting will be held on **Wednesday**, **July 19, 2023, at 6 p.m**.
