FDOT to Host State Road (SR) 932/NE 103 Street Design Project Public Meeting

April 9, 2024

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a meeting, both in-person and virtually, for a roadway design project along SR 932/NE 103 Street from NE 2 Avenue to NE 6 Avenue, starting at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, April 9, 2024.

A Hybrid (In-Person and Online) Public Meeting will be held at the Village of Miami Shores Council Chambers, 9900 NE 2 Avenue, Miami Shores, FL 33138. Click here to register.

Proposed improvements include: replacing damaged sidewalks; adding new pedestrian poles at the midblock crossing located just east of NE 5 Avenue; improving street lighting and maintaining existing landscaping.

Construction is scheduled to start in spring 2025 and last about four months. The preliminary construction cost is \$780,000.

The meeting will consist of a formal presentation followed by an open discussion. Staff will be available to answer questions in the order they are received and as time permits. If your question is not responded to during the meeting, a response will be provided in writing afterwards.
