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### **FDOT to Host Public Meeting for State Road (SR) A1A/South Roosevelt Boulevard Design Projects**

*April 7, 2021*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six will host a meeting, both in-person and virtually, for two roadway improvement projects along SR A1A/South Roosevelt Boulevard from Bertha Street to Smathers Beach and from Go Lane to SR 5/US 1/North Roosevelt Boulevard from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Wednesday, April 7, 2021.

An in-person meeting will be held at the City of Key West City Hall, 1300 White Street, Key West, FL 33040; and simultaneously online using GoTo-Webinar.

Project descriptions for each project are as follows:

#### **SR A1A/South Roosevelt Boulevard from Smathers Beach to Bertha Street**

Proposed improvements include: repaving and restriping the road; installing new signs and pavement markings; closing retaining wall gaps at the beginning and end of the project limits; reconstructing the existing Promenade along the south side of SR A1A and adding sidewalk along the north side; providing three pedestrian High-Intensity Activated Crosswalks (HAWKs); and elevating the road at specific locations and upgrading the drainage system. Construction is expected to begin in October 2023 and last about 37 months. The estimated construction cost for this project is \$11.5 million.

#### **SR A1A/South Roosevelt Boulevard from Go Lane to SR 5/US 1/North Roosevelt Boulevard**

Proposed improvements include repaving and restriping the road and upgrading pedestrian ramps. Construction is expected to begin in December 2023 and last about three months. The estimated construction cost for this project is \$454,000.

The meeting will consist of a formal presentation followed by an open discussion. Staff will be available to answer questions in the order they are received and as time permits. If your question is not responded to during the meeting, a response will be provided in writing afterwards.
