FDOT to Host State Road (SR) 948/NW 36 Street Multimodal Corridor Study Workshops

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six will host two corridor workshops, both in-person and virtually, for a Multimodal Study along SR 948/NW 36 Street from SR 826/Palmetto Expressway to SR 5/US 1.
