FDOT to Host State Road (SR) 915/NE 6 Avenue Virtual Public Hearing

December 16, 2020

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six will host a Virtual Public Hearing for the design of a roadway safety improvement project along SR 915/NE 6 Avenue from NE 147 Street to NE 154 Street from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Wednesday, December 16, 2020 via GoToWebinar.

The proposed improvements include: Repaving and restriping the roadway; adding a new traffic signal at the intersection of SR 915/NE 6 Avenue and NE 147 Street; reconstructing pedestrian ramps; adding two signalized mid-block crossings at NE 6 Avenue and the intersections just north of NE 150 Street and NE 154 Street; adding roadway median sections along SR 915/NE 6 Avenue at the mid-block crossings; adding a right turn only sign in front of the shopping center driveway located at the northwest corner of SR 915/NE 6 Avenue and NE 147 Street, providing new light poles and upgrading street signs.

Construction is expected to begin in November 2022 with the duration to be determined. The estimated construction cost for this project is \$1.3 million.
