### **FDOT to Host Public Hearing for the Five-Year Tentative Work Program**

*October 10, 2023*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a public hearing to present its Five-Year Tentative Work Program for fiscal years 2024/2025 thru 2028/2029. Projects programmed in Miami-Dade and Monroe counties over the next five years will be highlighted at this Hearing. The event will be held both in-person and virtually on Tuesday, October 10, 2023, starting at 6 p.m.
