Full Closure of Codadad Street for Railroad Crossing Rehabilitation Between Burlington Street and Ali Baba Avenue

Friday, January 23 through Tuesday, January 27 at the SFRTA Railroad Crossing

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), in coordination with the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA), will be closing Codadad Street, between Burlington Street and Ali Baba Avenue, in the City of Opa-locka, to rehabilitate the SFRTA railroad crossing.

This closure will be implemented continuously from 8 p.m. on Friday, January 23 through 6 p.m. on Tuesday, January 27. Local traffic will be detoured to the alternate routes noted in the map below. Law enforcement will be on-site and detour signage will be in place to assist motorists.

Northbound Codadad Street Detour via Burlington Street

- Turn right onto southbound State Road (S.R.) 817/NW 27 Avenue, from Burlington Street and make a U-turn at Vermont Street.
- Proceed along northbound S.R. 817/NW 27 Avenue and turn left onto Ali Baba Avenue to access Codadad Street.

Southbound Codadad Street Detour via Ali Baba Avenue

- Turn right onto S.R. 817/NW 27 Avenue, from Ali Baba Avenue, then turn right at Burlington Street to continue along Codadad Street.

Alternative Detour

- Motorists may choose Opa-locka Boulevard as an alternative route from either Burlington Street or Ali Baba Avenue.

Please note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unforeseen conditions.
