Full Closure of S.R. 90/SW 8 Street Between SW 107 Avenue and SW 117 Avenue

Saturday, January 24 through Sunday, January 25, 2026

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will implement a continuous full closure of State Road (S.R.) 90/SW 8 Street between S.R. 985/SW 107 Avenue and SW 117 Avenue beginning at 9:30 p.m. on Saturday, January 24 through 12 p.m. on Sunday, January 25, 2026. This closure is necessary to perform the concrete deck pour for the new pedestrian bridge.

Westbound S.R. 90/SW 8 Street: Closure from S.R. 985/SW 107 Avenue

Motorists traveling westbound will be detoured as follows:

- Travel south on S.R. 985/SW 107 Avenue
- Turn right onto S.R. 972/Coral Way/SW 24 Street
- Turn right onto SW 117 Avenue/Snapper Creek Canal Road
- Turn left onto westbound S.R. 90/SW 8 Street

Eastbound S.R. 90/SW 8 Street: Closure from SW 117 Avenue

Motorists traveling eastbound will be detoured as follows:

- Turn right onto SW 117 Avenue/Snapper Creek Canal Road
- Turn left onto S.R. 972/Coral Way/SW 24 Street
- Turn left onto S.R. 985/SW 107 Avenue
- Turn right onto eastbound S.R. 90/SW 8 Street

Southbound SW 109 Avenue: Closure Between SW 7 Street and SW 8 Street

Motorists traveling south on SW 109 Avenue wishing to access SW 8 Street should:

- Turn left onto SW 7 Street
- Turn right onto S.R. 985/SW 107 Avenue to reach SW 8 Street
