Full Closure of NW 22 Avenue for Railroad Crossing Reconstruction, June 7 to June 12

MIAMI, Fla. – The South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA) in coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), will close NW 22 Avenue from Ali Baba Avenue to State Road (SR) 9 starting at 7 p.m. Friday, June 7, through 4 a.m. Wednesday, June 12.

This detour is being established to allow workers to rehabilitate the railroad crossing. During this closure, all traffic will be detoured away from the crossing and directed to follow signs to alternate local streets. Traffic will be detoured as follows:

Southbound Detour:

- Turn right on NW 151 Street
- Turn left on NW 27 Avenue
- Turn left on NW 135 Street to go back to NW 22 Avenue

Alternative Southbound Detour:

- Turn right on Ali Baba Avenue
- Turn left on NW 27 Avenue
- Turn left on NW 135 Street to go back to NW 22 Avenue

Northbound Detour:

- Turn left on SR 9
- Turn right on NW 27 Avenue
- Turn right on NW 151 Street to go back to NW 22 Avenue

Please note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unforeseen conditions.
