Full Closure of SR 826/Palmetto Expressway Ramp to SR 817/NW 27 Avenue for Paving Tuesday, August 13, 2024

MIAMI, Fla. – As part of the ongoing FDOT Roadway Project along State Road (SR) 817/NW 27 Avenue from NW 135 Street to NW 187 Avenue, contractors will close the westbound off-ramp of SR 826/Palmetto Expressway at SR 817/NW 27 Avenue between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m., to repave the ramp.

Motorists traveling on SR 826/Palmetto Expressway wishing to access the westbound off-ramp to NW 27 Avenue will:

- Exit at NW 37 Avenue
- Proceed to NW 167 Street to access NW 27 Avenue

Law enforcement officers will be on-site to assist with traffic. Detours will be clearly marked. Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
