Full Closure of Florida's Turnpike at the Golden Glades Interchange *Sunday, September 15*

MIAMI, Fla. – All lanes along southbound and northbound State Road (SR) 91/Florida's Turnpike will be closed between SR 852/NW 215 Street/County Line Road and the Golden Glades Interchange starting at 9 p.m. on Sunday, September 15.

Travel lanes will reopen to traffic by 5 a.m. on Monday, September 16. This closure will allow Florida Power & Light (FPL) to perform utility work in preparation for upcoming work by the Golden Glades Interchange (GGI) Project.

All lanes along southbound SR 91/Florida's Turnpike will be closed at SR 852/NW 215 Street/County Line Road and traffic will be detoured as follows:

- Take Exit 47 to SR 817/NW 27 Avenue
- Turn right onto southbound SR 817/NW 27 Avenue
- Turn left for the ramp onto eastbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway and continue east to the Golden Glades Interchange

All lanes along northbound SR 91/Florida's Turnpike will be closed at the Golden Glades Interchange and traffic will be detoured via two options as follows:

Detour Route Option #1

- Take the ramp to northbound SR 7/US 441/NW 2 Avenue
- Turn left onto westbound SR 852/NW 215 Street/County Line Road
- Take the ramp onto northbound SR 91/Florida's Turnpike

Detour Route Option #2

- Take the ramp to westbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway
- Exit at SR 817/NW 27 Avenue
- Turn right onto northbound SR 817/NW 27 Avenue
- Turn right onto eastbound SR 852/NW 215 Street/County Line Road
- Take the ramp onto northbound SR 91/Florida's Turnpike

Detours will be clearly marked. Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions. Monday, September 16 and Tuesday, September 17 will be alternate dates.
