
Full Nighttime Closure of NW 116 Way and NW S River Drive Intersection

August 16 and August 17, 2022

MIAMI, Fla. – On Tuesday, August 16 and Wednesday, August 17, 2022, a full nighttime closure of the intersection of NW 116 Way and NW South River Drive will take place between the hours of 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. The closure will be implemented to allow the construction crews to install temporary signalization poles at the southwest and northeast corners of the intersection. The following detours will be implemented:

- If driving northbound on NW 116 Way who wish to access Okeechobee Road will be detoured to go east on to NW 106 Terrace, continue to NW 106 Street, turn right on to NW S River Drive, turn left on to NW 105 Way and proceed on to Okeechobee Road.
- If driving southbound on Hialeah Gardens Boulevard toward Okeechobee Road who wish to continue onto NW 116 Way will have to turn left on Okeechobee Road, make a right at NW 105 Way, make a right on to NW S River Dr, turn left on NW 106 Street to access NW 116 Way.
- If driving westbound on Okeechobee Road who wish to access NW 116 Way will be detoured to make a left at NW 105 Way, make a right on to NW S River Dr, turn left on NW 106 Street to access NW 116 Way.
- Motorists heading eastbound on Okeechobee Road who wish to access NW 116
 Way will be detoured to make a right at NW 105 Way, make a right on to NW S
 River Dr, turn left on NW 106 Street to access NW 116 Way.
- Local access will only be provided to motorists wishing to access NW S River Drive between NW 116 Way to NW 121 Way.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions.

This project is part of the corridor wide reconstruction of the SR 25/US 27/Okeechobee Road from the Broward County Line to SR 826/Palmetto Expressway. This work will improve safety, enhance mobility along this Strategic Intermodal Systems (SIS) corridor, and inspire innovative transportation solutions, connecting commuters throughout Miami-Dade County.
