Lane Closures on I-95 and I-395

MIAMI, Fla. – The following closures on I-95 and I-395 will be implemented as noted below:

I-95 Closures

- Friday, June 4 - Two lanes on northbound I-95 will be closed Friday, June 4 from NW 11 Street to NW 29 Street at 11 p.m. At 11:45 p.m., all three northbound I-95 lanes will be closed at NW 14 Street until 6 a.m. on Saturday, June 5. Drivers will be diverted to the I-195 ramp (Exit 4A) just after SR 836 to reconnect with northbound I-95. At 6 a.m. on Saturday, June 5, one northbound lane will reopen at NW 11 Street, and the remaining two closed lanes between NW 11 Street and NW 29 Street will reopen at 9 a.m.
- Friday, June 4 - Three lanes on southbound I-95 will be closed from NW 29 Street to NW 20 Street starting at 11 p.m. on Friday, June 4 until 9 a.m. on Saturday, June 5.

Westbound I-395 Mainline Lane Closures

- Friday, June 4 - One lane on mainline westbound I-395 will be closed over I-95 between the hours of 11:45 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions. The work is part of the I-395/SR 836/I-95 Design-Build Project that will reconstruct the I-395 corridor from the SR 836/I-395/I-95 (Midtown) Interchange to the MacArthur Causeway Bridge, including the construction of a Signature Bridge over NE 2 Avenue and Biscayne Boulevard; double-deck SR 836 from west of NW 17 Avenue to the Midtown Interchange and the replacement of the concrete pavement on I-95 from NW 8 Street to NW 29 Street.
