FDOT to Host a Public Information Meeting for I-95/SR 9 PD&E Study

December 5, 2024

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Six, will host a Public Information Meeting for the Interstate 95 (I-95)/State Road (SR) 9 PD&E Study from south of SR 860/Miami Gardens Drive to north of the Broward County Line, in Miami-Dade County, Florida. The purpose of the study is to address the operational deficiencies to relieve current and anticipated future congestion along the I-95/SR 9 corridor.
