### **Nighttime Closure of State Road (SR) 925/NW 3 Avenue Begins Tonight**

*From NW 7 Street and NW 8 Street*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – On Friday, April 16, northbound SR 925/NW 3 Avenue from NW 7 Street to NW 8 Street will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m., for the installation of an overhead sign structure. Law enforcement will be on site directing traffic through the area.

During this closure, the following detour will be implemented:

- Motorist traveling along northbound SR 925/NW 3 Avenue will be detoured through NW 5 Street, NW 2 Avenue and NW 8 Street in order to proceed along northbound SR 925/NW 3 Avenue or access the northbound I-95 on-ramp.

Drivers should expect delays and seek alternate routes if possible. Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
