State Road (SR) 922/NE 125 Street and NE 10 Avenue Daytime Closure Begins February 23

NE 10 Avenue will be detoured between NE 124 Street and NE 126 Street

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Tuesday, February 23, NE 10 Avenue will be closed between NE 124 Street and NE 126 Street for drainage being performed as part of the SR 922/NE 125 Street Intersection Improvement Project. The road will be closed daily between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. through Friday, February 26. A detour will be established for motorists who wish to continue north and south along NE 10 Avenue. Eastbound and westbound lanes along NE 125 Street will remain open.

Tuesday, February 23 and Wednesday, February 24

A section of NE 10 Avenue will be closed between NE 125 Street and NE 126 Street.

Motorists who wish to continue north on NE 10 Avenue will need to:

- Travel north on NE 10 Avenue
- Turn east on NE 125 Street
- Turn north on NE 12 Avenue
- Turn west on NE 126 Street
- Turn north on NE 10 Avenue

Motorists who wish to continue south on NE 10 Avenue will need to:

- Travel south on NE 10 Avenue
- Turn west on NE 126 Street
- Turn south on NE 9 Avenue
- Turn east on NE 125 Street
- Turn south on NE 10 Avenue

Thursday, February 25 and Friday, February 26

A section of NE 10 Avenue will be closed between NE 124 Street and NE 125 Street.

Motorists who wish to continue north on NE 10 Avenue will need to:

- Travel north on NE 10 Avenue
- Turn west on NE 124 Street
- Turn north on NE 9 Avenue
- Turn east on NE 125 Street
- Turn north on NE 10 Avenue

Motorists who wish to continue south on NE 10 Avenue will need to:

- Travel south on NE 10 Avenue
- Turn west on NE 125 Street
- Turn south on NE 9 Avenue
- Turn east on NE 124 Street
- Turn south on NE 10 Avenue

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
