Weekend Closure of NE 1 Avenue Starts March 16

MIAMI, Fla. – NE 1 Avenue, in Downtown Miami, will be closed between NE 11 Street and NE 13 Street from 5:30 a.m., Saturday, March 16 until 5:30 a.m., Monday, March 18, to allow workers for the I-395/State Road (SR) 835/I-95 Design Build Project to safely remove bridge structures over the roadway. Drivers on NE 1 Avenue can:

- Turn right on NE 10 Street, then turn left on Biscayne Boulevard
- Turn left on NE 13 Street to connects with NE 1 Avenue or access the westbound I-395 ramp

Closure and detour information can be seen <u>HERE</u>. Nearby residents and businesses should anticipate elevated noise levels during the demolition activities. The contractor will implement measures to minimize dust impacts.

Information on additional lane and ramp closures associated with the project can be seen HERE. Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions. The work is part of the I-395/SR 836/I-95 Design-Build Project that will reconstruct the I-395 corridor from the SR 836/I-395/I-95 (Midtown) Interchange to the MacArthur Causeway Bridge.
