NE 203 Street Railroad Crossing Closure Begins Friday November 11

MIAMI, Fla. – Brightline will close the railroad crossing located on NE 203 Street Between Biscayne Boulevard and West Dixie Highway in the City of Aventura starting at 10 a.m., Friday, November 11 through 5 a.m., Monday, November 14, 2022, weather permitting. This detour is being established to allow workers to reconstruct the railroad crossing.

During this closure, all traffic will be detoured away from the crossing and directed to follow signs to alternate local streets. Traffic will be detoured as follows:

From Westbound NE 203 Street:

- Turn right on Biscayne Boulevard
- Turn left on NE 208 Street
- Turn right on E Dixie Highway
- Turn left on NE 215 Street
- Turn left on W Dixie Highway to go back to NE 203 Street

From Northbound Biscayne Boulevard:

- Turn left on NE 186 Street
- Turn right on W Dixie Highway to NE 203 Street

From Southbound Biscayne Boulevard:

- Turn right on NE 208 Street
- Turn right on E Dixie Highway
- Turn left on NE 215 Street
- Turn left on W Dixie Highway to go back to NE 203 Street

Please note this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions. Eastbound NE 203 Street will not be affected.
