## NW 10 Avenue Railroad Crossing Closure Begins Tuesday October 18

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA) in coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), will close NW 10 Avenue from NW 21 Terrace to NW 23 Street in the City of Miami starting at 7 p.m., Tuesday, October 18 through 12 a.m. (midnight), Thursday, Oct. 27, 2022, weather permitting. This detour is being established to allow workers to reconstruct the railroad crossing.

During this closure, all traffic will be detoured away from the crossing and directed to follow signs to alternate local streets. Traffic will be detoured as follows:

#### Northbound Detour:

- Turn right on NW 21 Terrace
- Turn left on NW 7 Avenue
- Turn left on NW 23 Street to get back to NW 10 Avenue

#### Southbound Detour:

- Turn left on NW 23 Street
- Turn right on NW 7 Avenue
- Turn right on NW 21 Terrace to get back to NW 10 Avenue

**Please note this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.**
