SR 916/NW 135 Street/NW 136 Street Roadway Project Begins the week of June 10, 2024

From west of NW 30 Avenue to east of NW 27 Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway project the week of June 10 along State Road (SR) 916/NW 135 Street/NW 136 Street from west of NW 30 Avenue to east of NW 27 Avenue. The project will last about ten months and the current construction cost is \$3.3 million.

The scope of work for this project includes shifting the westbound Opa-locka Boulevard entrance further west and adding an additional eastbound left turn lane at the intersection of NW 135 Street and NW 27 Avenue. It also includes reconstructing sidewalks and pedestrian ramps, improving drainage and upgrading pedestrian signage and signals. Additionally, contractors will be installing traffic detection equipment at various locations and repaving and restriping the road.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes, sidewalks, and to establish detours at times. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction-related impacts. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible. Please use caution when traveling through construction zones.

Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
