FDOT to Host Public Meeting for the SR 948/NW 36 Street Improvements Corridor Study & the NW 67 Avenue Improvements Corridor Study

October 30, 2023

MIAMI, Florida. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a public meeting both in-person and virtually, for the State Road (SR) 948/NW 36 Street from SR 826/Palmetto Expressway to SR 5/US 1 Multimodal Study, in Miami-Dade County. This planning study is evaluating and developing improvements to address existing and future multimodal needs along the corridor.

Additionally, FDOT will also be presenting the NW 67 Avenue Corridor Improvements Study. The NW 67 Avenue corridor is approximately 0.81 miles long from SR 948/NW 36 Street and NW 22 Street, which is adjacent to the western section of the Miami International Airport (MIA) in Miami-Dade County, Florida. This corridor study will identify congestion management, safety mitigation strategies, multimodal and accessible transportation options, and innovative technology to improve overall quality of life along NW 67 Avenue.

The workshops will provide the community with an opportunity to evaluate the proposed alternatives. The information shared at both meetings will be the same.
