S.R. 886/Port Boulevard Roadway Project Begins on January 20, 2026

From S.R. 5/U.S. 1/Biscayne Boulevard to PortMiami

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway project on Tuesday, January 20, 2026, along State Road (S.R.) 886/Port Boulevard from S.R. 5/U.S. 1/Biscayne Boulevard to PortMiami in Miami-Dade County. The project will last approximately eight months and the current construction cost is \$3.6 million.

The scope of work for this project includes replacing sidewalks and the median concrete barrier; upgrading vehicular and pedestrian signals, signage, pavement markings, curb ramps, traffic railings, and shoulder barriers; installing new detectable warning surfaces; replacing concrete pavement; converting lanes at NE 5 Street to improve traffic flow, enhancing traffic signals at all signalized intersections, and repaving and restriping the road.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes and sidewalks and to establish detours at times. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction-related impacts. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible. Please use caution when traveling through construction zones.

Detours will be clearly marked. Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
