Pedestrian Safety Project S.R. 934/NW 79 Street and S.R. 25/NW 36 Street in Miami-Dade County Delivers Key Safety Improvements

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) along with their contractor AUM Construction Inc. announces the completion of a pedestrian safety project on January 30, 2026, along State Road (S.R.) 934/NW 79 Street at NW 32 Avenue and (S.R.) 25/NW 36 Street from east of NW 10 Avenue to west of NW 11 Avenue in Miami-Dade County.

The 11-month project supports FDOT Compass, the department's framework focused on ensuring Florida's transportation infrastructure meets the needs of residents, businesses, and visitors, now and in the future by enhancing safety, resiliency, supply chain efficiency, technology, and workplace development.

In line with FDOT's commitment to community safety and resiliency, the project delivered several key improvements. At S.R. 25/NW 36 Street, a new mid-block pedestrian crossing was constructed at NW 11 Avenue, along with sidewalk widening, driveway reconstruction, upgraded lighting, and new vehicular and pedestrian signals, signage, crosswalks, and curb ramps. At S.R. 934/NW 79 Street and NW 32 Avenue, the project included installing new traffic signals, replacing pedestrian curb ramps, upgrading vehicular and pedestrian signals, signage, and crosswalks, installing new vehicle detection equipment, and completing roadway repaving and restriping to extend the service life of the roadway.

The project also created opportunities for local contractors, resulting in positive economic benefits for workers and the surrounding community.

FDOT reminds motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists to remain alert and cautious when traveling through any construction or recently completed work zones.
