State Road (SR) 112/Arthur Godfrey Road/W 41 Street Extended Lane Closures Begin February 22

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Tuesday, February 22 through Wednesday, February 23, 2022, travel lanes along SR 112/Arthur Godfrey Road/W 41 Street will be closed for an extended period of time to install the traffic signal foundations at the intersections of Jefferson Avenue and Alton Road.

On **Tuesday, February 22**, one outside lane of westbound SR 112/Arthur Godfrey Road/W 41 Street will be closed at the intersection of Jefferson Avenue, and on **Wednesday, February 23**, one outside lane of eastbound SR 112/Arthur Godfrey Road/W 41 Street will be closed at the intersection of Alton Road.

During each operation, at least one travel lane will remain open at all times. Drivers may experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible. **Please use caution when traveling through construction zones and note this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.**

This work is part of the ongoing safety project along SR 112/Arthur Godfrey Road/W 41 Street from Alton Road to Meridian Avenue.
