### **State Road (SR) 112/Arthur Godfrey Road/West 41 Street Safety Project Begins June 7**

*From Alton Road to Meridian Avenue*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a pedestrian and bicycle safety project, the week of June 7, 2021, along SR 112/Arthur Godfrey Road/West 41 Street from Alton Road to Meridian Avenue. The project will cost an estimated \$402,282.

This project is part of a district-wide pushbutton contract. The work will last roughly six months and it includes: improving signalization and lighting; improving existing drainage structures; installing ADA-compliant sidewalks and pedestrian curb ramps; installing signage and pavement markings; and constructing a high emphasis pedestrian crosswalk at the intersection of West 41 Street and Jefferson Avenue.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes and sidewalks and establish detours at times. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction related impacts. Please use caution when traveling through the construction zone.
