### **State Road (SR) 90/SW 8 Street and SW 137 Avenue Nighttime Lane Closures Begin February 24**

**MIAMI, Fla.** – Beginning Thursday, February 24 through Thursday, March 3, 2022 between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m., travel lanes through the intersection of SR 90/SW 8 Street and SW 137 Avenue will be closed to repave the roadway. During the operation, at least one travel lane in each direction will remain open at all times.

Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible. **Please use caution when traveling through construction zones and note this schedule may change because of bad weather or other unexpected conditions.**
