State Road (SR) 112/I-195/Julia Tuttle Causeway Roadway Project Begins October 11

From east of SR 5/US 1/Biscayne Boulevard to SR 907/Alton Road

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway project the week of October 11, 2021. Work will take place along SR112/I-195/Julia Tuttle Causeway from east of SR 5/US 1/Biscayne Boulevard to SR 907/Alton Road in the cities of Miami and Miami Beach. The project will cost an estimated \$405,802 and is scheduled to be completed in fall 2021.

The scope of work includes: removing the rumble striping from the eastbound and westbound outside shoulder lanes, installing pavement markings; adding signage and removing the bicycle shoulder use along the causeway.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. Mondays through Thursdays. At least two lanes will be maintained at all times. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction-related impacts. Please use caution when traveling through construction zones.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
