SR 25/NW 36 Street Nighttime Closures Continue Through Thursday, December 19

Between NW 27 Avenue and NW 24 Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. – As part of the ongoing State Road (SR) 25/NW 36 Street Roadway Project, contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) are performing nighttime closures from NW 27 Avenue to NW 24 Avenue through Thursday, December 19 from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., to safely install drainage structures and repave the roadway. These closures follow the completion of drainage installation and removal of the concrete barrier wall on the north side of SR 25/NW 36 Street.

Motorists traveling westbound on SR 25/NW 36 Street wishing to access NW 25 Avenue will:

- Turn right on NW 27 Avenue
- Turn left on NW 35 Street
- Turn left on NW 25 Avenue

The speed limit through the work zone will be reduced to 35 miles per hour, and on-street parking will be temporarily removed during construction. Access to businesses and side streets will always be maintained.

Please follow the posted detour signage and note that drivers may experience delays while traveling through the area. This schedule may change due to weather or unexpected conditions.
