SR 25/NW 36 Street Traffic Shift Begins August 19

Between NW 27 Avenue to NW 22 Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. – As part of the State Road (SR) 25/NW 36 Street Roadway Project, contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will temporarily shift traffic between NW 27 Avenue and NW 22 Avenue beginning on Monday, August 19, to allow for the construction of new drainage along the project limits.

Traffic will be shifted onto the south side of NW 36 Street, and it will be reduced to one lane in each direction (eastbound and westbound) as shown below during the installation of the new drainage structures. Access to businesses and side streets will always be maintained. The speed limit through the work zone will be reduced to 35 miles per hour. This work is expected to last through late November.

Please note that on-street parking will be temporarily removed during construction. Please follow the posted signage and note that drivers may experience delays traveling through the area. This schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
