State Road (SR) 25/US 27/NW 36 Street Roadway Project Begins Week of October 30

From west of NW 7 Avenue to east of North Miami Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. –The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway project the week of October 30, 2023. The project limits extend along SR 25/US 27/NW 36 Street from west of NW 7 Avenue to east of North Miami Avenue in Miami-Dade County. This project will cost an estimated \$1.9 million and will take about six months to complete.

The scope of work includes installing pedestrian curb ramps, guardrails, detectable warning surfaces, signage, and pavement markings. Additionally, it involves replacing various traffic signals and adding traffic detection video equipment. The project also includes reconstructing damaged sidewalks and installing high-emphasis crosswalks at various locations, trimming trees to clear the line of sight, upgrading pedestrian signalization and pushbuttons and repaving and restriping the roadway.

Construction will be done in stages with temporary lane closures scheduled to avoid special community events and peak hours of traffic. Temporary sidewalk detours will be in place when necessary. Access to and from adjacent neighborhoods and businesses will be maintained during construction. Please note, this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
