SR 5/New Seven Mile Bridge Nighttime Single Lane Closure October 25 through 29

Along State Road (SR) 5/US 1/Overseas Highway

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning, Sunday, October 25 through Thursday, October 29, one lane on the SR 5/New Seven Mile Bridge, Mile Marker (MM) 40 to MM 46.8, will be closed from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., while workers restripe the road on the bridge.

During this closure, one lane will remain open. Flaggers will direct traffic through the work zone alternately. Drivers will need to stop before the bridge and wait for the flagger to direct them to cross. The speed limit will be reduced through the work zone and drivers should expect delays.

This schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions.
