## State Road (SR) 5/US 1/Overseas Highway Bridge Rehabilitation Project Begins November 1

Over the Tea Table Relief Bridge, Mile Marker (MM) 79.8

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a bridge rehabilitation project the week of November 1, on the Tea Table Relief Bridge, located on SR 5/Overseas Highway at Mile Marker (MM) 79.8, in Monroe County. The project will cost about \$873,000 and last about eight months. Work includes repairing and rehabilitating the bridge deck and other bridge elements.

To complete this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes, sidewalks, and establish detours at times. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction-related impacts. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternative routes if possible. Please use caution when traveling through construction zones.

Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
