State Road 5/US 1/Overseas Highway Lane Closures Begin March 1

Mile Marker (MM) 126 to MM 7.5

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Monday, March 1, daytime and nighttime lane closures along SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway are scheduled as noted below:

Mile Marker (MM) 126

Nighttime Closures:

- **Monday, March 1:** Two northbound lanes will be closed from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. The lane closure will extend from Card Sound Road to approximately SW 352 Street. One lane will remain open. All southbound lanes will be closed from 1 a.m. to 6 a.m. and traffic will be temporarily detoured through Krome Avenue.
 - Head south on SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway
 - Turn west on SW 352 Street
 - Head south on Krome Avenue
 - Turn south on US 1

Daytime Closures:

- **Thursday, March 4:** One northbound and southbound lane between Sexton Cove Drive and south of Andros Road will be closed from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Nighttime Closures:

- **Monday, March 1:** One northbound lane will be closed from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. and traffic will be shifted to the shoulder of the road.
- **Tuesday, March 2 and Wednesday, March 3:** Two southbound lanes will be closed from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Traffic in the southbound lanes will be temporarily detoured through the northbound lanes along SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway.

Daytime Closures:

- **Wednesday, March 3:** One northbound lane will be closed from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
