New Signing and Pavement Markings Installed at Key Largo School Along SR 5/Overseas Highway (MM 105)

MIAMI, Fla. – To manage traffic flow and prevent congestion, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has installed pavement markings showing a “Do Not Block” intersection symbol on the asphalt, as well as posted signs along SR 5/Overseas Highway at Key Largo School (MM 105).

This installation will provide visual cues to drivers, helping to guide them through the area, preventing traffic-related issues (blocking the intersection) and enhancing safety on the roadway. Images depicting signing and markings below:



Monroe County Sheriff traffic safety enforcement and educational detail will assist in managing traffic and issuing warnings and citations for those drivers who block the intersection. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area.
