State Road (SR) 5/US 1 Nighttime Lane Closures Begin February 6

At Stanford Drive and Alhambra Circle

MIAMI, Fla. – On Monday night, February 6 and Wednesday night, February 8, from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m., travel lanes along southbound SR 5/US 1 will be closed to install underground utility at Stanford Drive and Alhambra Circle in the City of Coral Gables. Work will be performed as follows. Please refer to closure maps below.

- **Monday, February 6, 2023:** The outside southbound lane on SR 5/US 1 and the eastbound right turn lane from Stanford Drive to southbound SR 5 will be closed.
- **Wednesday, February 8, 2023:** The outside southbound lane and the right turn lane from eastbound Alhambra Circle to southbound US 1 will be closed.

At least one lane of southbound SR 5/US 1 will remain open at all times. Access to southbound SR 5/US 1 from both Stanford Drive and Alhambra Circle will be maintained.

Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) will be on-site assisting motorists as needed. Drivers may experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

Please use caution when traveling through construction zones and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

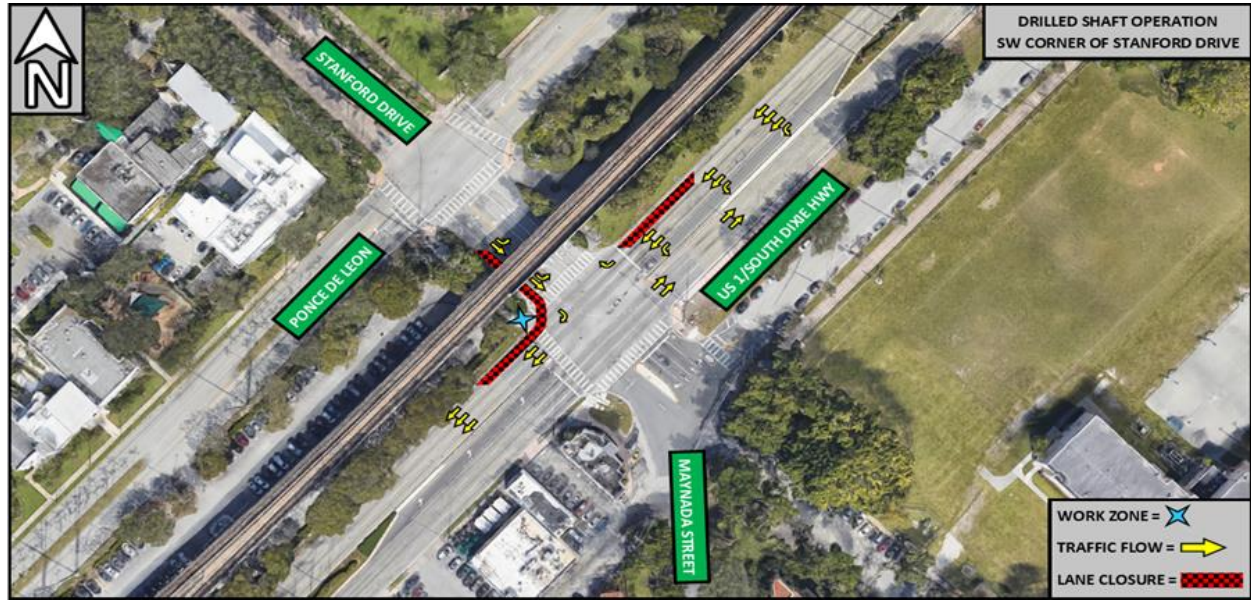
